The Hague Congress: de Madariaga, Churchill, Spaak and de Gasperi, among others, decide to found the College of Europe

1949

The College of Europe in Bruges was founded in response to WWII and to bolster the emerging European integration effort

1992

The College of Europe in Natolin was founded after the Cold War, when European integration already had several decades of history and experience, and great ambitions to cover more areas and geographies



EU PUBLIC AFFAIRS AND POLICIES

This major covers EU governance and critical policies like the internal market, competition, macroeconomics, migration, energy, environment, and social issues. Students study how EU institutions interact with external stakeholders and analyze complex challenges like employment, inflation, and economic growth.

THE EU AND ITS COMPLEX NEIGHBOURHOODS

This major allows students to obtain a better understanding of the multi-faceted policies of the EU towards the countries in the EU's neighbourhoods. It also provides an opportunity to study the political, socio-political, socio-economic, legal, energy, and identity related developments in the neighbourhood itself.

THE EU AND THE WORLD

This major explores two key aspects: challenges and global relations. Students study pressing issues like trade, investment, energy, governance, security, human rights, and more, all within the context of EU involvement. Additionally, students gain expertise in EU relations with global actors across Europe, Asia, Africa, the Americas, and other regions.

EUROPEAN HISTORY AND CIVILIZATION

This major fosters a deep understanding of European integration, encouraging students to rethink Europe's future through a study of its past. It features courses on democracy, totalitarianism, geopolitics, diplomacy, the making of the global economy and the fallout from European empires, and on history of Central and Eastern Europe, the Balkan countries, the Mediterranean and other seas.





STUDY TRIPS

2nd semester: REGIONAL VISITS

Two one-week-long study trips, one per each academic semester.

The study trips are an integral part of the study curriculum and provide students with a **full immersion** in topical issues on-site with key experts and decision makers.














EMPLOYMENT SECTORS



On average, our students secure employment within 3 months of graduation, with 60% in jobs and 40% in paid internships.

SCHOLARSHIPS FUNDED BY THE EU4YOUTH PROGRAMME

The College of Europe in Natolin is offering additional full scholarships for the postgraduate European Interdisciplinary Studies programme in 2024/25 to students coming from the Eastern Partnership countries. The scholarships cover tuition fee, full board and lodging on campus. They are funded under the "EU4Youth phase III Youth Employment and Entrepreneurship" programme, which receives funding from the EU and is co-financed by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Lithuania.







FEES AT THE COLLEGE OF EUROPE IN NATOLIN


The total fee for the academic year 2024-2025 is € 27 000 and covers both tuition and board & lodging

AT NATOLIN, TUITION COVERS:

- Tuition, registration, examinations
- Two study trips (fully covered)
- Summer Language Academy (English/French)
- · Language proficiency certificates
- Introductory courses before the start of the academic year

AT NATOLIN, BOARD AND LODGING COVER:

- Accommodation: en-suite private room and cleaning service (either on campus or in a villa/apartment adjacent to the campus)
- Meals: breakfast, lunch, dinner (including Sundays and public holidays)
- Medical care: students are provided by the College with access to basic ambulatory services off-campus. For more serious cases (hospitalisation), private insurance or European Health Insurance Card (for EU citizens) are needed.
- · Wi-Fi connection on the campus and all its facilities
- Sports facilities




